The **Dissertation**, containing 3 credits, will span all the two semesters. In the fourth semester, the student will study relevant literature, write the survey chapter, the theoretical/methodology chapter and research design for collection of data. In the third semester, the student will collect, collate and analyze data, and complete a 50-60-page dissertation.
